#### **Times and Seasons**

For most of us as each year progresses, we have particular times and dates which are significant to us. #### BARTON MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH



During the last days of 2022 and the first few weeks of 2023 we are given the opportunity to sort things out. Serious planning is needed so that the New Year runs as smooth as we can make it. Unfortunately my planning is not so good, insurance policies need reviewing, the car needs to be insured and an MOT on the car is essential for the year ahead. All of these problems seem to get me down and cause me to "WORRY", so from a personal perspective the preparation of this article has been a great help to me too. When I really sum it up and look around there are many others with far more difficult burdens to bear, putting my worries into a greater perspective, making me feel totally ashamed.

One of the pitfalls of living in our troublesome world is that we can become problem-centered rather than God—centered. When this happens, we lose the proper perspective. Gradually, all our problems begin to look huge and the strength of Almighty God seems small. Instead of moving mountains by faith, we become constant worriers, creating mountains of needless pressure for ourselves and others. The Bible says that instead of being weighed down by our concerns we should give them to God. The apostle Peter put it this way "Cast all your care upon Him for He cares for you" (1 Peter 5 v 7) and the apostle Paul in Philippians 4 v 6, gives us similar instructions "Be careful for nothing....". Jesus told His disciples not to worry about the necessities of life, because "....your Heavenly Father knows that ye have need of all these things..." (Matthew 6 v 32) The way to forget our worries is to concentrate on the goodness and loving care of God, not on the problems that get us down.

We are barely into 2023 let's make a concerted effort not to worry but face our coming problems and responsibilities with faith, trusting God for His grace and provision. He offers us more than a new perspective

He will renew our strength, and wings of faith will lift our hearts above our difficulties. Psalm 55 v 22 tells us "Cast your burden on the Lord and He shall sustain you". Believe it and worry will lose its grip on your heart".

#### **BARTON MILLS FOOTBALL CLUB/PAVILION**

The Parish Council have now taken control of the pavilion, and are now responsible for all costs involved, which includes insurance, water and electricity costs. #### **2023 LOCAL ELECTIONS**

On Thursday 4 May 2023, local elections are taking place across England. To vote at a polling station, you will now need to bring photo ID. Many forms of ID are accepted including: Passport; Driving License; Blue Badge; Senior Citizen's Bus Pass. You can still use your photo ID if it's out of date as long as it still looks like you. If you do not have a accepted photo ID then you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. The deadline to apply for this for the local elections on 4th May is the 25th April 2023. 

# Good Neighbour Scheme – Challenging times ahead

"The greatness of a community is most accurately measured by the compassionate actions of its members." Coretta Scott King

The quotation above admirably reflects the compassion of our neighbours in the community of Barton Mills and the eager and willing volunteers that form the Good Neighbour Scheme are keen to assist those people in the Parish who from time to time need their help.

The range of services that we can provide have been well publicised but to ensure that newcomers know that they can call upon our free help, here is a summary:collecting shopping or prescriptions; technical support (computers, TVs, phones); minor household repairs; one-off garden tidy-ups; form filling and letter writing; emergency meals; light housework; moving furniture; calling in for a chat and help with pets.

During November our volunteers were busy operating the Warm Welcome scheme that we established in the Church Room. The weather was mild during November and the numbers of villagers coming along to share the comforts and refreshments were few in number. We resumed this initiative in January but again there has been a very limited take-up of the offer of free hot drinks, snacks (sausage rolls, cakes and biscuits), freshly made hot soup and rolls. This has been somewhat disappointing for the fantastic team of volunteers who have given greatly of their time in operating the scheme and their talents in making delicious nutritional soups to help those for whom the hours of a warm room, hot drinks and soup could help with the rising cost of living.

From Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> January the Church Room will be open from 11.00am until 3.00pm on Tuesdays and Fridays but the service will be kept under review in order to ascertain whether it should continue into February and March if villagers are not requiring it. Alternative Warm Hubs are available at The Mildenhall Hub in Sheldrick Way and at the Pavilion next to the Jubilee Playing Fields in Mildenhall.

Our usual range of support services continue to be available. Those services, which are free of any charge, are designed to support villagers across the entire Parish of Barton Mills. 


